### HOW TO ENTER NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

- 1. Entries can be mailed to Ballarat A&P Society PO Box 401, Ballarat 3353, or online ballaratshow.org.au via showdayonline.com.au
- 2. Written entries must be submitted on the proper entry form (downloadable from ballaratshow.org.au) or available at the end of this booklet.
- 3.. Correct entry fees must accompany entry forms. (GST included in the stated entry fees. Cheques payable to Ballarat A& P Society). Entries

received after closing date will not be processed.

- 5. Please write your entries clearly and supply all the information asked for. When entering animals, please give all details requested on the entry form.
- 6. Please ensure your correct postal address is given for confirmation of entries if required.
- 7. Prize money in the Hand Crafts & Flowers will be paid at the time of collection. All other sections will be paid as per the section details
- 8. Exhibits may only be collected as stated or by arrangement with the Chief Steward of the relevant Sections or the Executive Officer. Times for collection detailed in the individual Section Regulations.

9. Carefully read the rules and instructions relating to your particular section entry to make sure that your entries are entered correctly in the appropriate classes.

#### GST, ENTRY FEES & PRIZE MONEY

The Ballarat Agricultural & Pastoral Society Inc is registered for GST. All entry fees include GST and the full amount is to be paid by exhibitors. Any exhibitor requiring a tax invoice will be provided with one on request.

#### **GENERAL REGULATIONS**

- 1. General entries must be made in WRITING on the Entry Forms, supplied by the Society & must be lodged with the Ballarat A&P Society. Showgrounds. The age of all exhibits of all livestock must be set forth in each entry.
- 2. At the time of entry, the class & section in which it is intended to exhibit must be stated & signed by or for the Exhibitor. A Ticket for each exhibit must accompany the exhibit when placed, & no exhibit will be received without such ticket. The exhibitors must take proper care of the entry tickets.
- 3. The Society invites the exhibition of any other articles or animals than those enumerated, & certificates may be awarded by the Judges to those considered deserving, but no certificates can be awarded by the Judges for extra exhibits if the prize list contains a section in which the same can compete.
- 4. Full entry fee (GST inc) must be paid at the time of lodging all entries & once paid will not be refunded.
- 5. The Committee is empowered to demand from any exhibitor a statutory declaration to the effect that any or all of his exhibits are made in conformity with these regulations, & in the event of the Committee being of the opinion that any exhibit is not so entered, it is authorised either to withhold the prize, if any, awarded to such exhibit, or to give it to the next highest competitor are made in conformity with these regulations, & in the event of the Committee being of the opinion that any exhibit is not so entered, it is authorised either to withhold the prize, if any, awarded to such exhibit, or to give it to the next highest competitor.
- 6. The Judges may award a second or third prize instead of a first one, or may withhold a prize altogether where there is only one exhibit or where the exhibits are not considered worthy.

- 7. No person shall be an exhibitor in section or sections in which he/she is a Judge or Steward.
- 8. The decision of the Judges shall be final & without appeal.
- Section tickets DO NOT admit exhibitor to the ground, & must be produced with each exhibit. NO EXHIBITOR PASSES WILL BE ISSUED.
- 10. Any prize or prizes awarded by the Society at any of its exhibitions, & left unclaimed for a period of four months from the date of award, may be forfeited & cancelled by the Executive Officer of this Society.
- 11. No industrial exhibit to be finally removed from the Exhibition before the hour of 4pm, on the last day of the Show, & no vehicle shall be admitted into the Showgrounds before 5pm, on that date for the removal of exhibits.
- 12. Every possible care will be taken of all exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society. All Exhibits left at the Showgrounds for a period of one month may be sold by the Society to defray expenses.
- 13. Only Authorised Persons will be admitted to the judging areas during judging of any section, & it shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any persons interfering with the Judges, & if necessary, order the removal of such offender from judging area.
- 14. Any infringement of these regulations will disqualify the exhibitor from taking a prize.
- 15. All competitors & exhibitors shall take part in competitions or attend at their exhibitions at their own risk; and in any case if any such exhibit, whilst on the Society's grounds, shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to other exhibits, competitors or exhibitors, or to the person or property of any member of the Society or the general public, the owner or owners of such exhibits shall indemnify & keep indemnified the Society, its officers & members, property & effects from & against all damages, costs, claims expenses, or liabilities incurred in connection with such exhibits.
- 16. Any protest made against exhibitors for infringement of the rules connected with the Annual Exhibition must be lodged with the

- Executive Officer before the hour of 4pm, on the last day of the Show, & such protest shall be dealt with at the Show by the Executive Committee or at some adjourned meeting of the Executive Committee. Each protest must be accompanied with a deposit of \$20, which sum shall be forfeited by the protester if the protest be found, after due investigation to be frivolous.
- 17. The Show will be open to Members who have paid their subscriptions for the current financial year on presenting the membership ticket at the entrance gate. The public will be admitted on each day of the Show from the advertised time & upon payment of the applicable charge.
- 18. In cases of dispute as to the construction of any of these regulations, the same shall be determined by the Executive Committee of the Society.
- 19. Entries to the Show are accepted subject to the rules & regulations & bylaws of the Society & of the Show.
- 20. The entrant agrees to be bound by those rules & regulations & by-laws.
- 21. The entrant also agrees to abide by all decisions made by the Society, by the Group with which it is affiliated or by VAS Ltd pursuant to those rules & regulations & by-laws.
- 22. No decision so made shall be called into question by the entrant before any court or other body (whether or not of a similar nature to a court) whatsoever.
- 23. The prize ribbons will be recognised as follows: First Prize, Blue; Second Prize Red; Third Prize, White; Special Prize, Green.
- 24. All trophies of a perpetual nature will be retained at the Showgrounds.
- 25. In compliance with Government Johnes Disease regulations cattle, sheep and goat exhibitors must have clean exhibits and animal transportation and supply their own forage and water containers.
- 26. Unless otherwise specified, all exhibits other than arena competitions must on the day of entry, be the property of the exhibitor.
- 27. Competitors in all Sections (including Arenas) will compete at their own responsibility and risk.
- 28. The Ballarat A & P Society will be taking photographs which may be used on the Society website, facebook and other advertising etc. Your attendance is considered permission for the images to be used.

## SAFETY REGULATIONS FOR EXHIBITORS & SITEHOLDERS

#### 1. Duty Of Care

All competitors have a Duty of Care to avoid exposing themselves and others to unsafe situations that could lead to property damage or personal injury. All persons must comply with any reasonable request of Ballarat A&P Society representatives.

## Direction by Ballarat Agricultural & Pastoral Society

Competitors must comply with any reasonable request of BAPS representatives.

#### 3. First Aid

During the Ballarat Show, FATE provides First Aid Services

#### 4. Emergency Facilities

Fire fighting and other emergency equipment must not be removed or used for any other purpose. Missing or unserviceable equipment should be reported to the Show office immediately.

#### 5. Hazard & Incident Reporting

Competitors must notify the Show office immediately of any hazards detected or incidents. Hazards or incidents are any situation that could result or has resulte in:

- a. the injury, illness or death of any person or animal,
- b. the damage, destruction or loss of property.

#### 6. Waste Disposal

All waste, including liquids must be disposed of responsibly.

Storm drains must not be used for the disposal of waste.

#### 7. Housekeeping

All areas must be kept in clean and tidy order with clearly defined and available access and exit routes at all times. Build up of combustible waste must be avoided.

#### 8. Slips, Trips & Falls

Care must be taken to minimise trip hazards and obstacles that people may walk into. Avoid laying unprotected cables or pipes on or above paths, walkways or roads.

#### 9. Media Comments

The Executive Officer coordinates media comment about matters involving Ballarat A&P Society or the Showgrounds.

#### 10. Smoking or Vaping

Smoking or Vaping is not permitted at the Ballarat Showgrounds.

#### 11. Electrical Equipment

- (a) Competitors should supply their own "Safety Switch" (RCD) for installation at each power outlet they use.
- (b) Extension cords must be earthed and all electrical appliances must be earthed or double insulated. Appliances must be in a sound working order.
- (c) The use of double adaptors is strictly prohibited, Power boards must be fitted with current overload protection.
- (d) Radiant electric or gas heaters are prohibited.
- (e) Light sockets must not be used for any other purpose than for lighting.
- (f) No naked flame permitted.
- (g) All Exhibitor electrical items (including leads) must have a current tag.

## GENERAL REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS

The regulations appearing in this schedule form part of the GENERAL REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS of entry to an event at the Ballarat Show.

#### 1. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

An exhibit must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor. An exhibit cannot be entered in more than one class.

An exhibit must have been made by the one exhibitor unless entered in a group class.

An exhibit must not have been entered at a previous Ballarat Show.

Exhibits must not have been worn, used or marked, except in junior competition (including Schools) where exhibits may have been worn at other exhibitions.

Exhibitors may wash/rinse exhibits for presentation, that is to remove any soiling that may have occurred in the making of the exhibit. Judges may reject any exhibits they feel are too soiled for Exhibition.

Exhibit tickets must be attached to each exhibit Unless otherwise stated.

#### 3. ENTRIES

Entries will be accepted either online through www. Showdayonline.com.au or the Ballarat Show web site www.ballaratshow.org.au and follow the steps outlined or written entry to the Ballarat Showgrounds

#### 5. DELIVERY OF ENTRIES

All craft and cookery exhibits to be delivered to the Ballarat Showgrounds either Tuesday evening between 6pm and 8pm or **Wednesday morning before 11am** as judging will commence at 11.30am.

#### 6. COLLECTION OF EXHIBITS

Exhibits will be available for collection between 4pm and 5.30pm on Sunday 12th November, 2023

#### 7. PRIZE MONEY

2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Certificate cards

#### CAKES & PASTRY

Cakes must be brought to the Showgrounds by 11.00am on Wednesday  $8^{th}$ ,November to be judged at 11.30am .

## MIDLAND GROUP COMPETITIONS

Midland Group classes are judged and move on to compete at the Midland Group Judging in 2024. Winners do not advance to State Level.

## VAS COMPETITION REGULATIONS

#### **VAS General Regulations**

- 1. Each Exhibit must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
- 2. Professionals are not eligible, which is defined as someone that works professionally or derives the greater percentage of their income in that craft, art form or technique.
- 3. The competitions follow the three levels of competition: Show Level, Group Level and State Level.
- 4. All work is to have been completed in the last twelve (12) months prior to its entry at a local show. 5. An exhibitor having won at Show level is not eligible to enter any other Show until after the Group Final judging.
- 6. An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at the 2024 Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final will then compete in the State Final at the 2024 Royal Melbourne Show.
- 7. An exhibitor is only eligible to represent one Group in the State Final.
- 8. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level, the second placegetter is eligible to compete.
- 9. An exhibit having won at State Final is no longer eligible to compete in the competition.
- 10. If an exhibitor is found to have won more than one Group Final the exhibitor must forfeit/refund all prizes and will be disqualified from exhibiting for 12 months.

## CHILDRENS COMPETITION REGULATIONS

An exhibit must have the age of the child & year level written on the exhibitor's tickets. Exhibits to be childs own work.

#### CHILDREN'S COOKERY, ART AND CRAFT SECTION

#### Class 1014 Carrot Cake Recipe

#### Ingredients

375g plain flour, 2 teaspoon Baking Powder, ½ teaspoon Bicarb Soda, 2 teaspoon ground cinnamon, ½ teaspoon nutmeg, ½ teaspoon allspice, 2 teaspoon salt, 345 gm castor sugar, 375ml vegetable oil, 4 eggs, 3 medium carrots, grated (350 grams), 220 g tin crushed pineapple, drained 180g pecan nuts crushed.

#### Method

- 1. Pre heat oven to 180C (160C fan). Grease a 20cm(8") round cake tin and line with baking paper.
- 2. Sift the dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil, then add to the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple and pecans. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into the cake tin.
- 3. Bake for approximately 90-100 minutes.
- 4. Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow to cool on the wire rack.

#### Class 1015 VAS Ltd Junior Boiled Fruit Cake

#### Recipe

#### Ingredients

375g Mixed Fruit, 3/4 cup brown sugar, 1 tsp mixed spice, ½ cup water, 125g butter, ½ tsp bicarbonate of soda, 2 eggs lightly beaten, 2 tablespoons marmalade, 1 cup self-raising flour, 1 cup plain flour, ¼ teaspoon salt, ½ cup sherry

#### Method

- 1. Place the mixed fruit, spice, sugar, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil.
- 2. Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove from stove add bicarb soda and allow to cool.
- 3. Add the sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well.
- 4. Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and <u>lined 20 cm round cake tin</u>.
- 5. Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1 ½ hours, or until cooked when tested.

#### Recipe Ingredients

2 ½ cups of self raising flour, 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon, 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg, 1 cup brown sugar (firmly packed),1 cup coarsely grated carrot, 1/3 cup chopped pitted dates, 1 tablespoon orange marmalade, 1 cup canola oil, 2 eggs, lightly beaten, 3/4 cup orange juice, 1 cup reduced fat milk

#### Method

- 1. Pre heat oven to 190°C (moderately hot)
- 2. Line a 12 hole muffin pan with round paper muffin cases Classic White Muffin Cases (35mm height x 90mm wide x 50mm base)
- 3. Sift dry ingredients into a large bowl; stir in dates, carrots. Then add the combined marmalade, oil, eggs, juice and milk. Mix until just combined.
- 4. Spoon mixture evenly into muffin paper cases in muffin pan.
- 5. Cook for 20 minutes. To test if muffins are cooked insert cake skewer; if it comes out clean the muffins are ready.
- 6. Stand muffins in pan for 5 minutes before removing to cool.
- 7. Show entries 4 muffins per paper plate

### DECORATED CAKES COOKERY FOR CHILDREN

Free-standing cakes must have a common base board. Base board not to exceed 50cms in any direction including diagonal. Elevated tiers must not overlap base board. No wire must penetrate icing or cake.

Ribbons, tulle, wire, non-synthetic stamens, edible colouring edible glitter (minimum amount) cachous, piping gel, coconut, posy picks and manufactured pillars may be used. Raffia and cord are permitted in presentation. No manufactured ornaments, dry gyp, lace or inedible glitter allowed, unless otherwise stated.

Dummy cakes are permitted as long as the same shape can be constructed in cake. Presentation taken into consideration. Cleats must be attached to all cake boards.


