HOW TO ENTER NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

1. Entries can be mailed to Ballarat A&P Society PO Box 401, Ballarat 3353, or online ballaratshow.org.au via showdayonline.com.au
2. Written entries must be submitted on the proper entry form (downloadable from ballaratshow.org.au) or available at the end of this booklet.
- 3.. Correct entry fees must accompany entry forms. (GST included in the stated entry fees. Cheques payable to Ballarat A& P Society). Entries received after closing date will not be processed.
5. Please write your entries clearly and supply all the information asked for. When entering animals, please give all details requested on the entry form.
6. Please ensure your correct postal address is given for confirmation of entries if required.
7. Prize money in the Hand Crafts & Flowers will be paid at the time of collection. All other sections will be paid as per the section details
8. Exhibits may only be collected as stated or by arrangement with the Chief Steward of the relevant Sections or the Executive Officer. Times for collection detailed in the individual Section Regulations.

9. Carefully read the rules and instructions relating to your particular section entry to make sure that your entries are entered correctly in the appropriate classes.

GST, ENTRY FEES & PRIZE MONEY

The Ballarat Agricultural & Pastoral Society Inc is registered for GST. All entry fees include GST and the full amount is to be paid by exhibitors. Any exhibitor requiring a tax invoice will be provided with one on request.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. General entries must be made in WRITING on the Entry Forms, supplied by the Society & must be lodged with the Ballarat A&P Society. Showgrounds. The age of all exhibits of all livestock must be set forth in each entry.
2. At the time of entry, the class & section in which it is intended to exhibit must be stated & signed by or for the Exhibitor. A Ticket for each exhibit must accompany the exhibit when placed, & no exhibit will be received without such ticket. The exhibitors must take proper care of the entry tickets.
3. The Society invites the exhibition of any other articles or animals than those enumerated, & certificates may be awarded by the Judges to those considered deserving, but no certificates can be awarded by the Judges for extra exhibits if the prize list contains a section in which the same can compete.
4. Full entry fee (GST inc) must be paid at the time of lodging all entries & once paid will not be refunded.
5. The Committee is empowered to demand from any exhibitor a statutory declaration to the effect that any or all of his exhibits are made in conformity with these regulations, & in the event of the Committee being of the opinion that any exhibit is not so entered, it is authorised either to withhold the prize, if any, awarded to such exhibit, or to give it to the next highest competitor are made in conformity with these regulations, & in the event of the Committee being of the opinion that any exhibit is not so entered, it is authorised either to withhold the prize, if any, awarded to such exhibit, or to give it to the next highest competitor.
6. The Judges may award a second or third prize instead of a first one, or may withhold a prize altogether where there is only one exhibit or where the exhibits are not considered worthy.

7. No person shall be an exhibitor in section or sections in which he/she is a Judge or Steward.
8. The decision of the Judges shall be final & without appeal.
9. Section tickets DO NOT admit exhibitor to the ground, & must be produced with each exhibit. NO EXHIBITOR PASSES WILL BE ISSUED.
10. Any prize or prizes awarded by the Society at any of its exhibitions, & left unclaimed for a period of four months from the date of award, may be forfeited & cancelled by the Executive Officer of this Society.
11. No industrial exhibit to be finally removed from the Exhibition before the hour of 4pm, on the last day of the Show, & no vehicle shall be admitted into the Showgrounds before 5pm, on that date for the removal of exhibits.
12. Every possible care will be taken of all exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society. All Exhibits left at the Showgrounds for a period of one month may be sold by the Society to defray expenses.
13. Only Authorised Persons will be admitted to the judging areas during judging of any section, & it shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any persons interfering with the Judges, & if necessary, order the removal of such offender from judging area.
14. Any infringement of these regulations will disqualify the exhibitor from taking a prize.
15. All competitors & exhibitors shall take part in competitions or attend at their exhibitions at their own risk; and in any case if any such exhibit, whilst on the Society's grounds, shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to other exhibits, competitors or exhibitors, or to the person or property of any member of the Society or the general public, the owner or owners of such exhibits shall indemnify & keep indemnified the Society, its officers & members, property & effects from & against all damages, costs, claims expenses, or liabilities incurred in connection with such exhibits.
16. Any protest made against exhibitors for infringement of the rules connected with the Annual Exhibition must be lodged with the Executive Officer before the hour of 4pm, on the last day of the Show, & such protest shall be dealt with at the Show by the Executive Committee or at some adjourned meeting of the Executive Committee. Each protest must be accompanied with a deposit of \$20, which sum shall be forfeited by the protester if the protest be found, after due investigation to be frivolous.
17. The Show will be open to Members who have paid their subscriptions for the current financial year on presenting the membership ticket at the entrance gate. The public will be admitted on each day of the Show from the advertised time & upon payment of the applicable charge.
18. In cases of dispute as to the construction of any of these regulations, the same shall be determined by the Executive Committee of the Society.
19. Entries to the Show are accepted subject to the rules & regulations & bylaws of the Society & of the Show.
20. The entrant agrees to be bound by those rules & regulations & by-laws.
21. The entrant also agrees to abide by all decisions made by the Society, by the Group with which it is affiliated or by VAS Ltd pursuant to those rules & regulations & by-laws.
22. No decision so made shall be called into question by the entrant before any court or other body (whether or not of a similar nature to a court) whatsoever.
23. The prize ribbons will be recognised as follows: First Prize, Blue; Second Prize Red; Third Prize, White; Special Prize, Green.
24. All trophies of a perpetual nature will be retained at the Showgrounds.
25. In compliance with Government Johnes Disease regulations cattle, sheep and goat exhibitors must have clean exhibits and animal transportation and supply their own forage and water containers.
26. Unless otherwise specified, all exhibits other than arena competitions must on the day of entry, be the property of the exhibitor.
27. Competitors in all Sections (including Arenas) will compete at their own responsibility and risk.
28. The Ballarat A & P Society will be taking photographs which may be used on the Society website, facebook and other advertising etc. Your attendance is considered permission for the images to be used.

SAFETY REGULATIONS FOR EXHIBITORS & SITEHOLDERS

1. Duty Of Care

All competitors have a Duty of Care to avoid exposing themselves and others to unsafe situations that could lead to property damage or personal injury. All persons must comply with any reasonable request of Ballarat A&P Society representatives.

2. Direction by Ballarat Agricultural & Pastoral Society

Competitors must comply with any reasonable request of BAPS representatives.

3. First Aid

During the Ballarat Show, FATE provides First Aid Services

4. Emergency Facilities

Fire fighting and other emergency equipment must not be removed or used for any other purpose. Missing or unserviceable equipment should be reported to the Show office immediately.

5. Hazard & Incident Reporting

Competitors must notify the Show office immediately of any hazards detected or incidents. Hazards or incidents are any situation that could result or has resulted in:

- a. the injury, illness or death of any person or animal,
- b. the damage, destruction or loss of property.

6. Waste Disposal

All waste, including liquids must be disposed of responsibly.

Storm drains must not be used for the disposal of waste.

7. Housekeeping

All areas must be kept in clean and tidy order with clearly defined and available access and exit routes at all times. Build up of combustible waste must be avoided.

8. Slips, Trips & Falls

Care must be taken to minimise trip hazards and obstacles that people may walk into. Avoid laying unprotected cables or pipes on or above paths, walkways or roads.

9. Media Comments

The Executive Officer coordinates media comment about matters involving Ballarat A&P Society or the Showgrounds.

10. Smoking or Vaping

Smoking or Vaping is not permitted at the Ballarat Showgrounds.

11. Electrical Equipment

- (a) Competitors should supply their own "Safety Switch" (RCD) for installation at each power outlet they use.
- (b) Extension cords must be earthed and all electrical appliances must be earthed or double insulated. Appliances must be in a sound working order.
- (c) The use of double adaptors is strictly prohibited, Power boards must be fitted with current overload protection.
- (d) Radiant electric or gas heaters are prohibited.
- (e) Light sockets must not be used for any other purpose than for lighting.
- (f) No naked flame permitted.
- (g) All Exhibitor electrical items (including leads) must have a current tag.

SHEEP SECTION REGULATIONS

Entries are restricted to Sheep bred in a current registered flock and exhibited by members of their breed society as approved by the Ballarat Sheep Show Committee. Lamb born 2023 must be tagged with current year electronic tag. All sheep are to have PIC tag in the ear all exhibitors must comply with the specific regulations of their breed society. Classes with sufficient entries (as determined by BAPS) may be split on shearing date. Please ensure shearing date is provided on entry form. Groups are to be drawn from ordinary classes. Pairs are not to be drawn from ordinary classes

- ANIMAL HEALTH STATUS**-No animal shall be permitted from a flock or property that has had:
- Virulent Footrot within the last 12 months.
 - Johne's disease (in current government withholding period)
 - Ovine Brucellosis - entries accepted from accredited flocks only
 - Any sheep found with lice or ticks shall immediately be removed from the Society's grounds
 - Exhibitors should note that sheep will be penned with compliance to Govt OJD regulations.

All Exhibitors must provide evidence of the current OJD status of their flock with entries to ensure that appropriate penning arrangements can be provided

(see regulation 25).

A Trophy donated by Ballarat Stock & Station Agents Association will be awarded to the Champion Longwool Exhibit, the Champion Shortwool Exhibit, the Champion Cleanskin Exhibit and the Champion Interbreed Group. **The Supreme Interbreed Champion will receive a sash and perpetual trophy.**

NATIONAL SHEEP HEALTH DECLARATION - EXPLANATORY NOTES

Overview

Completing this National Sheep Health Declaration (NSHD) will assist prospective buyers to make an informed decision about the health status and management history of these sheep. The NSHD is mandatory for all sheep movements in SA and for sheep being moved into NSW and Tasmania. It is voluntary in other states.

Livestock Production Assurance (1)

Livestock Production Assurance (LPA) program accreditation means that a property must have a biosecurity plan for the property. [The National Farm Biosecurity Reference Manual for Grazing Livestock Production](#) can be used to develop plans or further information including templates is available at: www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/what-we-do/endemic-disease/farm-biosecurity-plan

Footrot (3 and 4)

3. Virulent footrot is defined differently in each state. For information on this and interstate movements of sheep, producers should visit the relevant state department website or contact animal health staff from that department.

4. If answered Yes, all mobs should have been checked during at least one spread period, and any lameness investigated, with no symptoms of the disease observed. If answered no, producers can add any information about the disease and their management of it; e.g. whether any testing has been carried out, or what treatments may have been used recently.

Lice (5)

All mobs should be checked for lice at least twice each year. Any sheep seen with rubbed fleece or pulled wool should be checked for lice as a matter of urgency. Further information is available at: www.pardboss.com.au

Approved Vaccinate (7)

A sheep that is identified by an NLIS (sheep) 'V' tag and is:

- vaccinated with an approved JD vaccine by 16 weeks of age, OR
- vaccinated with an approved JD vaccine after 16 weeks of age, when the flock:
 - was in the SheepMAP, or
 - had undertaken a negative Faecal 350 test in the two (2) years preceding the vaccination, or
 - had a Negative Abattoir-500 status at the time of vaccination.

SheepMAP (8)

An audited quality assurance program incorporating a property biosecurity plan, animal health risk assessment, testing, and movement controls that provide a source of low risk animals. Note - the level of testing varies depending on the status. Date of last test should be recorded in Q9.

Types of tests that may be recorded (9)

Faecal 350: A test of 350 representative sheep over 2 years of age (or all sheep over 2 years of age in smaller flocks) by Pooled Faecal Culture (PFC) or High Throughput Johnes' (HT-J) PCR in pools of up to 50 sheep. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.

Abattoir 500: At least 500 sheep, over 2 years of age, have been submitted to an abattoir in the past 24 months, in 1 or more lots, have been examined and all found negative for JD. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.

Abattoir 150: At least 150 sheep, over 2 years of age, have been submitted to an abattoir in the past 12 months, in 1 or more lots, have been examined and all found negative for JD. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.

JD management practices (10)

Any other management practices carried out for JD could be recorded here; e.g. types of introductions to the flock, or veterinary investigations.

Other relevant health information (11)

Any other information that a producer thinks may be relevant can be recorded here; e.g. participation in an active grower group, One Biosecurity, or other biosecurity initiatives, mulesing status, pain relief usage, etc.

Declaration

Signing this declaration has legal significance under fair trading and other relevant state legislation. Regulatory authorities may also take legal action, and purchasers may seek damages for any information that is incorrect. Before signing you must be satisfied you understand all elements of the document, and these explanatory notes.
