HOW TO ENTER NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

- 1. Entries can be mailed to Ballarat A&P Society PO Box 401, Ballarat 3353, or online ballaratshow.org.au via showdayonline.com.au
- 2. Written entries must be submitted on the proper entry form (downloadable from ballaratshow.org.au) or available at the end of this booklet.
- 3.. Correct entry fees must accompany entry forms. (GST included in the stated entry fees. Cheques payable to Ballarat A& P Society). Entries

received after closing date will not be processed.

- 5. Please write your entries clearly and supply all the information asked for. When entering animals, please give all details requested on the entry form.
- 6. Please ensure your correct postal address is given for confirmation of entries if required.
- 7. Prize money in the Hand Crafts & Flowers will be paid at the time of collection. All other sections will be paid as per the section details
- 8. Exhibits may only be collected as stated or by arrangement with the Chief Steward of the relevant Sections or the Executive Officer. Times for collection detailed in the individual Section Regulations.

9. Carefully read the rules and instructions relating to your particular section entry to make sure that your entries are entered correctly in the appropriate classes.

GST, ENTRY FEES & PRIZE MONEY

The Ballarat Agricultural & Pastoral Society Inc is registered for GST. All entry fees include GST and the full amount is to be paid by exhibitors. Any exhibitor requiring a tax invoice will be provided with one on request.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

- 1. General entries must be made in WRITING on the Entry Forms, supplied by the Society & must be lodged with the Ballarat A&P Society. Showgrounds. The age of all exhibits of all livestock must be set forth in each entry.
- 2. At the time of entry, the class & section in which it is intended to exhibit must be stated & signed by or for the Exhibitor. A Ticket for each exhibit must accompany the exhibit when placed, & no exhibit will be received without such ticket. The exhibitors must take proper care of the entry tickets.
- 3. The Society invites the exhibition of any other articles or animals than those enumerated, & certificates may be awarded by the Judges to those considered deserving, but no certificates can be awarded by the Judges for extra exhibits if the prize list contains a section in which the same can compete.
- 4. Full entry fee (GST inc) must be paid at the time of lodging all entries & once paid will not be refunded.
- 5. The Committee is empowered to demand from any exhibitor a statutory declaration to the effect that any or all of his exhibits are made in conformity with these regulations, & in the event of the Committee being of the opinion that any exhibit is not so entered, it is authorised either to withhold the prize, if any, awarded to such exhibit, or to give it to the next highest competitor are made in conformity with these regulations, & in the event of the Committee being of the opinion that any exhibit is not so entered, it is authorised either to withhold the prize, if any, awarded to such exhibit, or to give it to the next highest competitor.
- 6. The Judges may award a second or third prize instead of a first one, or may withhold a prize altogether where there is only one exhibit or where the exhibits are not considered worthy.

- 7. No person shall be an exhibitor in section or sections in which he/she is a Judge or Steward.
- 8. The decision of the Judges shall be final & without appeal.
- Section tickets DO NOT admit exhibitor to the ground, & must be produced with each exhibit. NO EXHIBITOR PASSES WILL BE ISSUED.
- 10. Any prize or prizes awarded by the Society at any of its exhibitions, & left unclaimed for a period of four months from the date of award, may be forfeited & cancelled by the Executive Officer of this Society.
- 11. No industrial exhibit to be finally removed from the Exhibition before the hour of 4pm, on the last day of the Show, & no vehicle shall be admitted into the Showgrounds before 5pm, on that date for the removal of exhibits.
- 12. Every possible care will be taken of all exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society. All Exhibits left at the Showgrounds for a period of one month may be sold by the Society to defray expenses.
- 13. Only Authorised Persons will be admitted to the judging areas during judging of any section, & it shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any persons interfering with the Judges, & if necessary, order the removal of such offender from judging area.
- 14. Any infringement of these regulations will disqualify the exhibitor from taking a prize.
- 15. All competitors & exhibitors shall take part in competitions or attend at their exhibitions at their own risk; and in any case if any such exhibit, whilst on the Society's grounds, shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to other exhibits, competitors or exhibitors, or to the person or property of any member of the Society or the general public, the owner or owners of such exhibits shall indemnify & keep indemnified the Society, its officers & members, property & effects from & against all damages, costs, claims expenses, or liabilities incurred in connection with such exhibits.
- 16. Any protest made against exhibitors for infringement of the rules connected with the Annual Exhibition must be lodged with the

- Executive Officer before the hour of 4pm, on the last day of the Show, & such protest shall be dealt with at the Show by the Executive Committee or at some adjourned meeting of the Executive Committee. Each protest must be accompanied with a deposit of \$20, which sum shall be forfeited by the protester if the protest be found, after due investigation to be frivolous.
- 17. The Show will be open to Members who have paid their subscriptions for the current financial year on presenting the membership ticket at the entrance gate. The public will be admitted on each day of the Show from the advertised time & upon payment of the applicable charge.
- 18. In cases of dispute as to the construction of any of these regulations, the same shall be determined by the Executive Committee of the Society.
- 19. Entries to the Show are accepted subject to the rules & regulations & bylaws of the Society & of the Show.
- 20. The entrant agrees to be bound by those rules & regulations & by-laws.
- 21. The entrant also agrees to abide by all decisions made by the Society, by the Group with which it is affiliated or by VAS Ltd pursuant to those rules & regulations & by-laws.
- 22. No decision so made shall be called into question by the entrant before any court or other body (whether or not of a similar nature to a court) whatsoever.
- 23. The prize ribbons will be recognised as follows: First Prize, Blue; Second Prize Red; Third Prize, White; Special Prize, Green.
- 24. All trophies of a perpetual nature will be retained at the Showgrounds.
- 25. In compliance with Government Johnes Disease regulations cattle, sheep and goat exhibitors must have clean exhibits and animal transportation and supply their own forage and water containers.
- 26. Unless otherwise specified, all exhibits other than arena competitions must on the day of entry, be the property of the exhibitor.
- 27. Competitors in all Sections (including Arenas) will compete at their own responsibility and risk.
- 28. The Ballarat A & P Society will be taking photographs which may be used on the Society website, facebook and other advertising etc. Your attendance is considered permission for the images to be used.

SAFETY REGULATIONS FOR EXHIBITORS & SITEHOLDERS

1. Duty Of Care

All competitors have a Duty of Care to avoid exposing themselves and others to unsafe situations that could lead to property damage or personal injury. All persons must comply with any reasonable request of Ballarat A&P Society representatives.

Direction by Ballarat Agricultural & Pastoral Society

Competitors must comply with any reasonable request of BAPS representatives.

3. First Aid

During the Ballarat Show, FATE provides First Aid Services

4. Emergency Facilities

Fire fighting and other emergency equipment must not be removed or used for any other purpose. Missing or unserviceable equipment should be reported to the Show office immediately.

5. Hazard & Incident Reporting

Competitors must notify the Show office immediately of any hazards detected or incidents. Hazards or incidents are any situation that could result or has resulte in:

- a. the injury, illness or death of any person or animal,
- b. the damage, destruction or loss of property.

6. Waste Disposal

All waste, including liquids must be disposed of responsibly.

Storm drains must not be used for the disposal of waste.

7. Housekeeping

All areas must be kept in clean and tidy order with clearly defined and available access and exit routes at all times. Build up of combustible waste must be avoided.

8. Slips, Trips & Falls

Care must be taken to minimise trip hazards and obstacles that people may walk into. Avoid laying unprotected cables or pipes on or above paths, walkways or roads.

9. Media Comments

The Executive Officer coordinates media comment about matters involving Ballarat A&P Society or the Showgrounds.

10. Smoking or Vaping

Smoking or Vaping is not permitted at the Ballarat Showgrounds.

11. Electrical Equipment

- (a) Competitors should supply their own "Safety Switch" (RCD) for installation at each power outlet they use.
- (b) Extension cords must be earthed and all electrical appliances must be earthed or double insulated. Appliances must be in a sound working order.
- (c) The use of double adaptors is strictly prohibited, Power boards must be fitted with current overload protection.
- (d) Radiant electric or gas heaters are prohibited.
- (e) Light sockets must not be used for any other purpose than for lighting.
- (f) No naked flame permitted.
- (g) All Exhibitor electrical items (including leads) must have a current tag.

INSPECTIONS: All stock exhibited in the cattle sections may be inspected by an Inspector, appointed by the Society, who will examine the tattoo brands on all stock exhibited and if the animals are found to be incorrectly branded, they will be disqualified. HOSES: Exhibitors are advised to provide own hoses, and 12.7mm fittings (½ inch) ELECTRICAL LEADS: All exhibitors' electrical equipment including, but not limited to, extension leads, blowers, clippers etc. must be tested & have a current test tag attached. If leads are joined together they are also to be covered with a

waterproof connector cover.

JUNIOR CHAMPIONS will be awarded to each breed provided that a minimum 15 head are exhibited and there is competition. Points will be allocated but not counted unless required to separate equal scores in Aggregate Awards.

STRAW: One small square bale of bedding straw per head will be provided. If you require extra straw, please bring your own.

FEED CONTAINERS: Exhibitors who are part of the MAP program must have feed containers, the top to be **450mm** above ground level.

CATTLE RESTRAINTS/HANDLING

All bulls exhibited must be led into the Showgrounds and led out for the Judge's inspection.

Non-compliance with this condition will cause the animal to be disqualified. All led steers must be tractable.

All male exhibits of beef and dual purpose cattle over 9 months of age shall be rung through the nose and at all times, shall be led by such ring. If, in the opinion of the Stewards or Society's officials, any bull is considered unsafe, such bull shall be placed under such control as directed by the Stewards or Society's officials.

All females must be provided with effective halters and be thoroughly broken to lead. Exhibitors are required to see that each of their exhibits is securely tethered in its stall. All exhibitors of beef cattle must provide neck straps or neck ropes, as well as halters for tethering their cattle.

Every poll bull and every wholly or partially dehorned bull entered in beef and dual purpose sections must be securely tethered by an effective headstall in addition to a nose ring or neck strap or neck rope.

If, in the opinion of the Senior Steward, any exhibits of stock are deemed to be dangerous, the owner of such exhibit or exhibits shall immediately, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or exhibits from the Society's grounds.

BIOSECURITY

Victorian Cattle

a) All Victorian cattle are eligible for entry provided they are not from a herd located on a property under quarantine restrictions for Bovine Tuberculosis or Brucellosis and meet the requirements below.

Johnes Disease

- A) A current **National Cattle Health Statement** is to accompany entry forms.

 Please **download** from the cattle section of the Ballarat Show website or contact the Show Office.
- B) All exhibitors must provide the PIC number for the property where the show entries are located.
- C) All cattle must be ear tagged with an NLIS ear tag. They will be scanned during the show.
- D) All beef cattle must have a J BAS score of a minimum 6

E) All dairy exhibitors must provide a correct Dairy Assurance Score

Pestivirus

All **BEEF** cattle being shown must be tested Pestivirus free by an authorized veterinary laboratory or veterinary officer. Please mark appropriate boxes on the National Cattle Health Statement. Pestivirus results for each animal must be supplied with entries. If entries are submitted online, then please fax or email results through to the BAPS office. CLIPPING FRAMES:

There will be a maximum of four (4) clipping frames allowed in the BEEF shed at a cost of \$50 per frame space. Allocation of

the frames will be on a first in basis per entry forms received. They are to be used by the owner and at the owner's risk.

CHAMPIONSHIP:

Only winners of ordinary classes are eligible to compete for a Championship.

Championship Sashes will be awarded for each Breed.

The Society reserves the right to combine or delete classes should entries be insufficient.

CLASSES:

Will be available for the Feature Show and those Breeds which entered in the previous year's competition; however, competition is open to all registered Breeds.

Group of Three (both sexes to be represented - owned by Exhibitor) - Excluding Feature shows.

PRIZEMONEY:

All prizemoney can be collected at the main office after 1pm on Saturday 11th & Sunday 12th November.

JUDGING: To be judged taking into account the presentation, handling and general stockmanship.

Eligibility for entry will be determined by the Stewards.

- Age of Parader must be 8 years & over as of the day of the Show.
- Parader must be attired in suitable clothing including solid shoes or boots.
- Handler to lead a heifer only under 2 years (as of the day of the Show).
- Handler's animal must be eligible for breed registration with their respective Breed Society or entered in an ordinary class with details of exhibit on the respective Show/event entry form for insurance purposes.
- The judge may ask the Parader to swap animals if required.
- Adult or Steward assistance is acceptable for Parader under 12 years.
- Competitions can be split into several age groups depending on the number of entries and level of experience.
- Parader Competitions are conducted

under the FCAS & VAS Ltd regulations and National final competitors must be over 15 years of age at the time of the State final and reside within Victoria.

- 1. Competitors must be under the age of 25 years on the day of competition at the Ballarat Show.
- 2. Competitors must undertake that if placed first or second they will compete at higher levels until eliminated.
- 3. Not less than three animals of one breed will be provided for judging, and such animals will be placed in order 1st, 2nd, 3rd, etc by the Competitor in accordance with points awarded. Five animals will be provided at State and National levels.

4. Each Competitor will be allowed equal time (15 minutes suggested) and will be provided with a card on which he or she will indicate the number of points he or she awarded to each animal. On completion, the card is handed to the Steward for presentation to the Judge, who will allocate further points in accordance with the direction shown on part two of the scoreboard, and may, if he so desires, question the Competitor on any points in his judgement, or any other feature in connection with the cattle being judged.

NATIONAL CATTLE HEALTH DECLARATION EXPLANATORY NOTES

OVERVIEW

The Cattle Health Declaration is a legal document. Please complete accurately before signing.

Cattle Heath Declarations are a way for producers to provide information about the health status of the cattle they are selling. Buyers should ask vendors for a Declaration and use the information provided to determine the health risks associated with the animals on offer.

Some states/territories require testing or certification additional to that outlined in this document e.g. Johne's disease (JD) in WA and for Enzootic Bovine Leucosis (EBL) in Tasmania. Please check the entry requirements for any interstate movements at:

www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/what-we-do/endemic-disease/livestock-movements

The original of this form is to be attached to the National Vendor Declaration (NVD) form accompanying the cattle, if applicable. A duplicate remains with the vendor; it is recommended the vendor retains a copy of this declaration for seven (7) years.

TREATMENTS & VACCINATIONS

Provide details on any cattle treatments in the last six (6) months and vaccinations within the last twelve (12) months.

Some manufacturers include more than one of the categories listed in the same vaccine, known as a combination vaccine. If you use a combination vaccine, each agent(s), as appropriate, should be detailed.

For vaccinations to be current, you must have followed the manufacturer's recommendation for vaccination. Typically, young animals or first time vaccinated animals need two (2) doses, followed by annual boosters. As variations to this general rule do occur (e.g. Silirum is given once only), you must use the manufacturer's recommendations.

At the date the declaration is made and as a result of the vaccination(s) given, the animals are considered protected from the diseases marked as treated.

QUESTION 3: PESTIVIRUS TESTING

Persistently infected animals can be detected by conducting a pestivirus antigen test. This test only needs to be conducted once in an animal's life. Cattle that test positive in most cases are persistently infected animals. Pestivirus antibody testing may be done to check the pestivirus status of the herd. Contact your veterinarian for assistance.

QUESTIONS 4, 5 & 6: JOHNE'S DISEASE BEEF CATTLE

Note: JD is a notifiable disease, so it is important to answer these questions.

Occurrence of JD refers to clinical disease in the herd or on the property(s). Clinical disease is an infected animal with chronic diarrhoea and weight-loss that does not respond to treatment.

The **Johne's Beef Assurance Score** (J-BAS) is a voluntary tool developed for JD risk profiling. Details are available at www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/jd-cattle-tools. The J-BAS is an initial guide and purchasers should ask for more information about JD in the origin herd (see the JD in Cattle Biosecurity Checklist on the 'JD in cattle' webpage). The National Farm Biosecurity Reference Manual - Grazing Livestock Production provides a template to use for the property biosecurity plan. All plans should include the JD in Cattle Biosecurity Plan Checklist.

Check test – testing of 50 adult animals in the herd (or all eligible animals in a herd if less than 50 adult animals) biased to increase the probability of detecting infection, tested by (pooled) faecal culture or (pooled) HT-J faecal PCR. An ELISA test is available but is not recommended and also not accepted for entry of cattle to WA.

Sample test – screening of the adult herd or a large representative sample of the adult herd by an approved test (pooled) faecal culture or (pooled) HT-J faecal PCR. See note above for ELISA test.

Grazing of non-bovine species – Buyers of cattle from this consignment may consider the grazing of other JD-susceptible species (sheep, goats, alpacas) on the source property as important to their risk-management decisions. These buyers are entitled to seek information on how you have managed disease risks for all your livestock.


